Previously, people with disabilities who required nursing and other assistance lived in segregated homes or institutions far removed from everyday society. This model implements their right to be part of the greater community.

### "Intervention in families with a young child with developmental intellectual disabilities" course in Jerusalem

For many social workers, interacting with parents is one of the most important and significant challenges of their jobs. In 2014 we conducted a course in Jerusalem entitled "Intervention in families with a young child with developmental intellectual disabilities." This course gave a variety of professionals in the field an opportunity for joint learning and reinforcement of skills and techniques. The course was so successful that a follow-up practicum was requested by many participants, which will take place later this year.

#### Characteristics and Implications of Intimate Relationships among Couples with Intellectual Disabilities Prof Shunit Reiter, University of Haifa

This unique study investigated the effects of intimate relationships compared to those of platonic friendships for people with intellectual disabilities. It found that these relationships have a positive effect on the quality of life and self-imagine of the couple. It additionally proposed that society abandon the question of "whether or not" to support this issue and to instead focus on "how" to safely encourage it.
